

**INSTRUCTIONS TO HAVE FIREARMS
PICKED UP BY LAW ENFORCEMENT**

Federal (18 U.S.C. Section 922) and Illinois (430 ILCS 65) laws restrict a person from possessing a valid Firearm Owner's Identification Card (FOID), any firearm, or ammunition if a person is convicted of a domestic violence misdemeanor crime or is the respondent of a qualifying Order of Protection or another qualifying court order.

In the state of Illinois a valid FOID card is required to legally carry, possess or buy any firearm and/or ammunition.

Pursuant to a court order, you have been ordered to turn in all firearm(s) to the _____ (Sheriff/local law enforcement office). **Follow these instructions:**

1. Contact _____ for the pick up of prohibited firearms, at (XXX) XXX-XXXX during normal business hours, (list business hours). Inform the officer (deputy, police officer, detective, etc.) that the court has ordered you to turn in your firearms to the _____ (Sheriff/local law enforcement office) and arrange a time for an officer to pick them up immediately . Have your case number available (number is printed on the court order).
2. If the (deputy, police officer, detective, etc.) is not available, leave a detailed message, including your name, phone number(s) and case number. You will be contacted to schedule an appointment. If you have not received a phone call back within (1) business day you must call again to arrange for the surrender of your firearm(s).
3. You must have a copy of the court order with you when the officer arrives.
4. You must obtain a receipt from the (Sheriff/local law enforcement office) to provide proof to the court that you have turned in you firearm(s). You must then provide this receipt to the court.

Note: The potential penalty for possessing a firearm without a valid FOID card is a prison term of up to five (5) years.
